Sunday, May 22, 2016 11 am-4:30 pm


Begin at Darwin Martin House Complex Northwest corner of Jewett and Summit

The 19th Annual Parkside Garden (and Architecture) Tour

Sunday, June 26, 2016, 10 am-4 pm

Begin at Church of the Good Shepherd Southeast corner of Jewett and Summit

Parkside is home to some of Buffalo's most avid and talented gardeners. Whether a modest container garden neophyte or a prolific green thumb, all are invited to participate in this year's tour. Visitors come from all parts of Western New York, and some even come from Canada, to marvel at our unique melding of centuryold homes and relaxation spaces embellished with personal favorites of floral shapes and colors.

All are welcome to tour the local gardens nestled between the beautiful homes of Parkside in the 19th Annual Parkside Garden and Architecture Tour on Sunday, June 26. A full color map and garden directory will be available for \$5 on the day of the tour outside the Church of the Good Shepherd. The maps will direct you to the highlighted gardens and "Parkside Architecture Notes" will be posted throughout the neighborhood, pointing to design elements of our homes.

For those wishing to learn more of the history of our historic Fredrick Law Olmsted-designed neighborhood, there will be guided walking tours highlighting architectural styles and elements interspersed with local Gilded Age residents' history and folklore. Sign up on the day of the tour for \$10, on a first-come, first-served basis.

You can also explore the site of the future gardens of the Darwin Martin House, Frank Lloyd Wright's prairie-style architectural masterpiece, where plans are underway to restore the once-extensive Wright-designed landscape. Remnants of the historic greenhouse are still visible and attest to the importance of cut flowers and flowering plants to Mrs. Martin. Horticulturist Nellie Gardner and volunteers will be on hand to answer questions. Historic photos will be displayed in the Visitors' Center and there will be free tours of the Conservatory.

Finally, you can enjoy fare from the food trucks and ice cream cycles that will be in the neighborhood on the day of the tour.

This year we will be developing the architecture part of the Garden and Architecture Tour in a partnership with Buffalo Architecture Foundation (BAF). The BAF invites you to share your Building (or Garden) Story, which will be available online through a QR code symbol on the day of the Tour and will be archived by UB. As part of BAF's Building Stories program, visitors will be able to learn more about individuals' homes and gardens, supplementing and complementing your interactions with visitors. By scanning the QR code provided, visitors will gain an insider's perspective to these wonderful and unique spaces.

Buffalo Architecture Foundation invites you to share a personal story of your experience of architecture and place in Western New York. Whether a sentimental reflection on a cherished spot or a philosophical piece about a local landmark, we welcome the unique narratives that you share with us. Express you story any way you choose to, through prose, poetry, photography, original artwork, music, recorded spoken word, or any other way. It's your story and we want you to have fun telling it!

Through a partnership with the University of Buffalo Libraries and BAF, this program, called "Building Stories," is accessible as a digital collection at UBdigit, home to collections encompassing a wide variety of formats including photographs, print materials, audio recordings, artworks, artifacts, and other resources.

The Building Stories digital collection supports BAFs mission of inspiring the exploration and appreciation of architecture and how it shapes our lives by reaching out to a wider audience and preserving your stories. Please visit the collection at
